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<p>General Comments</p> <p>Licensing Staff arrived at the facility to introduce themselves as the new Quality Assurance Monitor. The indoor environment was organized, bright and welcoming upon arrival. The children were engaged in a variety of activities in the classroom. One Educator was observed sitting at a table with a small group of children as they played with Play-Doh. A bin full of Play-Doh accessories such as rolling pins, scissors and different animal cookie cutters was observed on the table. The children were working together to make fish out of their Play-Doh.</p> <p>Other children were observed playing with cars, scooping and pouring colorful beans and pasta in sensory bins and using magnetic tiles to build houses for their rubber ducks. The Educator asked the children if they would like to gather together to sing songs and practice letters. The children worked well together to put all the toys away before gathering together in the cozy corner. The Educator sat with the group and went over letter, numbers and sang songs. The Educator was expressive when singing this morning. The group danced and sang " 5 Little Monkeys" and "Herman the Worm".</p> <p>Proper hand washing was observed before the children ate morning snack. One Educator sat and read "Mr. Strong Looks for a Job" as the children ate. The Educators encouraged independence by offering to start peeling an orange and having the child finish the task. As the children finished eating, they prepared for outdoor play time. It is evident the children are familiar and comfortable with the daily routine. The transition from inside to the outdoor play space was smooth. Outside, the children played in the sandbox, explored pushing balls down the slide and pushed large trucks around the playground. The group played several active games together such as "What time is it Mr. Wolf" and "Red light, Green Light".</p> <p>Pick up time was observed. Families were greeted; guardians were given updates from the morning. Only positive child guidance was observed during today's visit. The Educators were patient, nurturing and attentive to the needs of the children.</p>
