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General Comments Upon licensing staff's arrival, the school age children were engaged in outdoor play. The outdoor environment offered a variety of play opportunities, including a gaga ball pit, sandbox, play structures, ball hockey area, slack lines, and monkey bars. The space also provided plenty of shade from the trees. Children were observed climbing the trees, and educators set reasonable limits on how high they were allowed to climb. Educators were engaged with the children throughout outdoor play. One educator was observed playing jump rope with the children, showing them different ways to use the ropes. The group took turns jumping while others held the rope, and they also played games such as limbo together. When it was time to transition indoors for lunch, an educator encouraged the children to help clean up by asking each child to pick up eight toys before heading inside. During the lunch routine, not every child was observed washing their hands before eating. A conversation took place with the operator to ensure proper handwashing procedures are consistently followed as part of the daily routine. After lunch, the children participated in free play indoors. Some children were observed cutting cardboard and creating crafts using pom-poms and other loose materials, while others chose different activities around the room. The summer camp has weekly activity plans in place that provide a variety of experiences for the children. Children's artwork and activities were displayed throughout the environment. Children's files and educator files were reviewed and found to be complete. Only positive child guidance was observed throughout the visit. Licensing staff recommends the program for renewal.
