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General Comments

Upon licensing staff's arrival for the renewal inspection, children were outdoors eating their snack at the picnic tables. The program consisted of two school-age summer groups. The plan for the morning was to remain outdoors, with a planned afternoon activity related to the week's theme, "Mission Impossible." Strings were to be set up to represent "lasers," allowing children to navigate through and around them.

Following snack, an educator facilitated a game of tag with the children. Children were also able to freely engage with the ball hockey area, sandboxes, play structures, and a variety of outdoor play materials. The outdoor shed contained a wide selection of accessible, school-age-appropriate materials that children could independently select and use based on their interests. Some children used baking molds in the sandbox to create pretend foods, such as donuts and cookies. An educator was also observed playing ball hockey with a group of children.

The indoor environment was organized and offered a variety of areas for children to play and explore. Craft areas, dramatic play spaces, building areas, and reading corners were available throughout the environment. An activity related to the week's theme was also displayed on the wall, where children had created their own secret agent identification tags.

Throughout the morning, children were able to come indoors with supervision to use the bathroom and refill their water bottles as needed. First aid kits were present and accessible at all times. Educators were observed engaging with the children during play and using positive child guidance practices throughout the visit.

Children transitioned indoors for lunch at approximately noon and washed their hands before sitting down.

Staff and child files were found to be in compliance.

Licensing staff recommends the program for renewal.
