## **General Comments**

Licensing staff arrived at the facility to conduct the annual renewal inspection. Upon arrival, the children and Educator were in the nature park area playing. The first aid backpack, attendance form, water bottles and morning snack items were observed to be present.

The children were eager to share that this week, for summer camp, they would be learning about Switzerland. Activities were planned and a taste testing of cheese and chocolate was ready for afternoon snack. While outside, children were observed playing in the wooded nature park with soccer balls, ring toss rings, building villages with small sticks, leaves and rocks, and playing in the wooden playhouses. Some of the children had found green caterpillars and were showing their friends the tiny homes they had built for the caterpillars. Gentle reminders and positive words of encouragement were heard on being kind and respectful to nature. While playing, there was evidence of routine and boundaries as the children were heard asking the Educator to retrieve play material from outside of the marked lines. Later in the morning the children wrote on leaves and hid them for others to find. Educators were actively engaged in play with the children and was attentive to their needs. Before leaving the nature park area, a head count was observed, water bottles and lunch bags were collected.

Once indoors, proper hand washing was observed and the children played freely while the Educators set up chairs at the main tables for lunch. The indoor play areas were clean, organized and inviting. Play material such as Lego, Lincoln Logs, wooden blocks, craft supplies, and book were in good condition and easily accessible to the children. There were cubbies for the children's art creations and lunch boxes. Children's artwork and large colourful web planning with different animals from around the worlds were on display. To reflect the weekly theme of Switzerland, a train set with mountains and animals was set up on a table and the Educator was heard explaining the afternoon craft to the children while they ate their lunch together.

During inspection, child and staff files were verified. Monthly fire drills are being completed and logged. The bulletin board in the main entry way was organized with required licensing documentation. Allergy information was clearly posted and the EpiPen was out of reach of children but easily accessible for Educators. Only positive child guidance was observed during the inspection.
