<b>General Comments</b>
<p>The Quality Assurance Monitor is on site for a monitoring inspection. During the inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor was able to observe the children during nap time, during moments of transition, and during snack time and during outdoor free play.</p> <p>During the inspection, the educators disinfected each nap mats before putting them away. The children were able to do calm activities while waiting for the nap mats to be put away. The children washed their hands before and after their snack and the educators helped their children get ready to go outside. The educators were observed encouraging the children to develop their autonomy by asking them to put away their personal belongings and trying to get dressed on their own.</p> <p>An educator has shared with the Quality Assurance Monitor that Wednesday is their imaginary play day. The educator explained that on Wednesdays the children are able to bring toys from home and play with their friends during free play with their toys.</p> <p>Today a child from the preschool room performed a show and share by doing a make-up tutorial for her group. The educator was able to show the documentation of the child's experience. When the parent arrived to pick up their child, the educator and operator shared their child's experience while doing the tutorial.</p>

General Comments

During the inspection, two children in the preschool group bumped their head against one another. The educators comforted the children and looked at the injured areas. The Quality Assurance Monitor asked the operator if they are going to prepare an incident report for the incident to advise the parents. The operator shared that they do not currently complete reports for head bumps unless they have put ice or if an injury leaves a mark or a scratch. The Quality Assurance monitor recommended that an incident report be completed anytime an injury to the head happens since concussion symptoms can present itself only several hours after the injury. This way all head injuries even minor head injuries are communicated with the parents and are documented. The operator validated that they will start completing incident reports for all head injuries. When the children were playing outside, the child's educator noticed that the child had developed a small bump on their head. They placed some ice on the head and validated that they see the importance of completing incident reports.

Positive child guidance was observed during the inspection. A child had accidentally hurt another while playing with a toy. The operator took the time to listen to the children and took the time to validate their feelings. The operator explained the importance of being careful of our environment and encouraged the children to make reparations.
