Comments: In the junior pre-k room baby oil and mod podge spray were observed on an out of reach shelf among the art supplies but should be stored locked due to their toxicity. Aloe vera was observed above the desk In this room.								
Near the kitchen, in the senior pre-K area, we observed a can of interior wall paint and bottle of rubbing alcohol out of reach but unlocked.								
Air freshener sprays were observed on high shelves but unlocked in a bathroom and the infants' change room. In the infant sleep room air freshener spray was observed in a low cupboard, unlocked. Rubbing alcohol was observed unlocked on a high shelf in the infant's change room.

General Comments

Megan Munden. When we arrived the children under the age of 2 were enjoying their snack and the toddlers and pre-schoolers were preparing to go outside.

I observed well organized and personalized areas for the children's belongings, including their names and photos. This organization and labelling continued throughout other areas of the centre including their baskets in the diaper changing areas. The indoor spaces incorporated nature well with plants, pet fish, wooden toys, and wooden décor.

There was ample documentation of the children's learning throughout the centre including art projects, photos, and write-ups by educators. These were displayed at levels where the children could see them. We observed ample and varied activities and supplies indoors including books, art supplies, and toys, at accessible levels for the children.

Their outdoor play space is undergoing some changes to allow for a wider variety of activities. They have removed their large play structure and plan to replace it with smaller activities and more natural elements. Educators were observed to be patient and engaged with the children, comforting them when they were upset and encouraging their questions and curiosity.

First aid kits were observed both indoors and being taken onto the playground and on walks. Supplies were observed in the kits but the monthly checklists were not. The operator took the checklists home to re-stock items.
