<p>General Comments</p> <p>At the beginning of the visit, there were a few preschool children present and they were playing together. A while later, the school age children started to arrive. They all had free play before having a snack and then getting ready to go outside. The children appear to know the routine well, and transitions of the group from one activity to another went smoothly. Proper handwashing and mask wearing was also observed during the visit.</p> <p>Positive child guidance was shown by the educators. They were engaged with the children by sitting and doing activities with them. Relationships with the children appeared to be respectful and positive. The educators used techniques such as redirection, gentle reminders, positive reinforcement and active listening with the children.</p> <p>There are a variety of age appropriate materials available for the children in the classroom. All materials were accessible for the children to play with. There were various centers that the children could choose from, and they were spaced well throughout the classroom; there was no congestion of children at the centers. Children's work was displayed on the walls. I suggest to add some learning stories, or other forms of documentation, as well.</p>
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General Comments

I looked at staff and child files during my visit. Several child files were missing immunization records or exemptions which will need to be obtained. Staff files have all necessary documentation. I also noticed air freshener in the washroom that needed to be locked up, and this was corrected immediately.
