The administrator obtains copies of the missing certificates immediately and places them in the employee files. Deficiency is now compliant.

Comments: Inspector verifies all staff files during the renewal inspection. 2 of the employee files were missing a copy of the Social Development check. Administrator retrieves the copy from the Human Resource department and places it in the employee file. Deficiency is now compliant.

Comments: Inspector observes that the infant outdoor play area only consists of one type of surface. The operator must ensure that the outdoor play area of a facility must consist of more than one surface to permit different types of play.						
33(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall provide outdoor play area materials and equipment that are varied and in sufficient quantity for the number and ages of the children receiving services at the licensed facility.		33(1)	May 30,			
Comments: Inspector observes the outdoor play area does not have sufficient material variety and quantity for all the children present. Operator must ensure that the outdoor play area provides a variety and sufficient quantities materials for all children present.

Inspector is onsite to complete the renewal inspection. Inspector observes outdoor play, children playing freely indoors, lunch time and the rest period for all age groups. Inspector observes a common theme of easter

activities was completed in the daily planification during the entire week.

The inspector had a discussion with the administrator regarding children who are unable to transition to the 2year-old classroom on their second birthday. Children may remain in the infant classroom until the transition becomes possible. However, the operator must ensure that all eligible infants are transitioned to the 2-year-old classroom before enrolling any additional preschool-aged children into the facility.
