Comments: Exemption request to come. The operator began her early childhood course online in May.

Comments: The play structure inside the daycare is made of wood and the bars are less than an inch apart. The slide is commercial, no protective surface. The structure is currently closed with an empty shelf in front of the steps. During my visit, no child was around the indoor play structure. The structure is not stable, it wobbles and it should be hung on the wall. Discussion with the operator of the possibility of removing the play structure from the daycare.			
31(3) An operator shall maintain the outdoor play area of a licensed facility to ensure the safety of the children.	31(3)	Jun 18, 2021	
Comments: The protective surface for non-commercial play equipment is not sufficient (less than 1-3 inches depending on the structure). Outdoor play structures including swings cannot be used if they do not have the protective surface required by the manufacturer's manual. It is important to scrape for the protective surface to conform. In addition, you need to remove medium and large rocks from the protective surface.			
39(2) A licensed facility shall have a separate locked storage space that is inaccessible to the children for each of the following: (b) medications.	39(2)(b)	Jun 02, 2021	
Comments: The medications are in a white cabinet, the cabinet is not locked, but locked by a childproof.			

General Comments

The daycare meets the requirements of the Early Childhood Services Act and New Brunswick regulation according to the ratio.

Observation, 2 children went to have their snacks at the table during my visit and the educator sits up to the level of the child to talk with him about the behavior and use a positive explanation to how to behave.

No change request has been made for the approval of Infant Rest Area and Infant Room. Both rooms must not be used. The license is approving 2-12 years old, only.

A cot or nap mat appropriate for the height of the child for each child who is at least 15 months of age and under five years of age who takes naps.

A crib or portable playpen for each child under 15 months of age in accordance with the Cribs, Cradles and Bassinets Regulations and the Playpens Regulations under the Canada Consumer Product Safety Act (Canada).

No infant is allowed in the daycare since the etablissement is not licensed for infant.
