Comments: No change. The structure has been moved but it's not yet stable and it must be attached to the wall. In addition, it lacks a rung in height and the mat under the slide does not stay in place. Photos were taken. The structure cannot be used by children as long as the modifications have not been made. The play structure inside the daycare is made of wood and the bars are less than an inch apart. The slide is commercial, puzzle mats have been put in double thickness as a protective surface.
