Comments: The structure has been repaired, the protective surface is still missing. There is a shelf in front of the structure, but the children continue to try to go and play there. Toys should be removed from the structure. Photos were taken. The structure cannot be used by children as long as the modifications have not been made. The play structure inside the daycare is made of wood and the bars are less than an inch apart and it's stable. The slide is commercial, puzzle mats need to be put in double thickness as a protective surface.
