Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that a copy of a valid first aid (FA) certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certificate are missing in 9 of the 15 employee files. The operator must ensure that a copy of a valid first aid (FA) certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certificate are maintained in all the educator's file.			
12(3) An operator of a licensed facility shall ensure that a criminal record check or a vulnerable sector check, as the case may, and a check with the Department of Social Development is conducted on each staff member and associated person at least every five years.	12(3)	Dec 16, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that 3 out of 15 employee files verified contained expired criminal record / vulnerable sector checks. The staff members can continue to work at the facility, as planned. An order for compliance is issued and the educators have 10 days to submit a valid criminal record/vulnerable sector check. During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that 4 out of 15 employee files verified contained expired checks with the Minister of Social Development. The staff members can continue to work at the facility, as planned. An order for compliance is issued and the educator have 10 days to submit a valid check with Social Development.

Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector finds that daily activities are not deliberately planned and documented. The operator must ensure that programming is deliberately planned and documented.			
21 The daily activities of a licensed facility shall be purposely planned in advance and documented and shall respond to the capabilities, needs and interests of each child and shall include (b) indoor and outdoor opportunities for physical activity.	21(b)	Dec 16, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that children were not provided with outdoor play time. Part-time programs operating for less than 4 hours are required to have outdoor play of at least half an hour.

Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that children were not provided with outdoor opportunities for physical activity. Part-time programs operating for less than 4 hours are required to have outdoor play of at least half an hour.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (c) staff member records that include (ii) the staff member's qualifications including the certificates or training referred to in paragraph 11(b) or (c).	24(1)(c)(ii)	Dec 09, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that an Early Childhood Education certificate is missing in one of the employees' files. The operator must place a copy of the Early Childhood Education certificate in the employee's file.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (c) staff member records that include (iv) a signed declaration confirming that the staff member has read and understood his or her obligations under the Act and this Regulation.	24(1)(c)(iv)	Dec 09, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that the staff signed statement regarding obligations under the Act and licensing regulation was missing in 1 or 15 staff files verified. The operator must ensure that a signed copy of the statement regarding obligations under the Act and licensing regulation is maintained in the educator's file.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (c) staff member records that include (vii) a copy of a valid first aid certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation certificate for each administrator and educator.	24(1)(c)(vii)	Dec 21, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that a copy of a valid first aid (FA) certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certificate are missing in 9 of the 15 employee files. The operator must ensure that a copy of a valid first aid (FA) certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certificate are maintained in all the educator's file.			
39(1) A licensed facility shall have storage space that includes: (b) easily accessible space to store the personal belongings of each child receiving services at the licensed facility.	39(1)(b)	Dec 16, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed children storing their bookbags, lunch boxes and outdoor wear on the gym floor. A licensed facility shall have easily accessible space to store the personal belongings of each child receiving services at the facility.			
39(2) A licensed facility shall have a separate locked storage space that is inaccessible to the children for each of the following: (a) toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies;	39(2)(a)	Dec 06, 2022	Dec 06, 2022
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed a child open the door to a storage area which contained cleaning products. The educator immediately locked the door. Deficiency is now compliant.			
40(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall ensure that personal belongings of a child receiving services at the licensed facility that are brought to the licensed facility, including combs, brushes, toothbrushes, towels, washcloths, bedding, pacifiers and soothers, are (c) stored separately for each child.	40(1)(c)	Dec 16, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed children storing their bookbags, lunch boxes and outdoor wear in a large pile on the gym floor. The operator must provide each child with a place for personal belongings. Keeping items separate avoids the risk of losing or mixing up personal belongings and also reduces the risk of spreading communicable diseases.

44 An operator of a licensed facility shall have a first aid kit that is equipped with the contents prescribed by New Brunswick Regulation 2004-130 under the Occupational Health and Safety Act as a first aid kit that is not a personal, Type P first aid kit, and a telephone in working order (c) on each outing.	44(c)	Dec 07, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that an educator left the premises to pick up children from school and did not bring a first aid kit. The operator must ensure that educators have immediate access to a well-stocked first aid kit to ensure that care for minor injuries is provided as soon as possible.			
45(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall require a parent or guardian of a child receiving services at the licensed facility to (b) indicate whether the absence is due to illness or otherwise.	45(1)(b)	Dec 09, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that the reason for absences were not indicated on the daily attendance sheets. The operator shall require parents or guardians to notify the facility if the child will be absent and whether the absence is due to illness or otherwise.			

General Comments

During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed a Christmas coloring activity, indoor free play and snack time.

The bus was not on location during the renewal inspection; therefore, it will be inspected during the follow-up inspection.

The inspector had a discussion with the administrator in regard to placing all written consents given by the child's parent or guardian in the child's files.

The ratio was respected during the inspection.
