Comments: The inspector reviews employee files and notes that one file is missing a copy of the renewed First Aid certificate. The administrator promptly obtains the updated certificate from the main center and places it in the employee's file. Deficiency is now compliant.

Comments: The inspector reviews all employee files. One file is missing the approved Social Development check, including the verification date. The administrator promptly obtains a copy from the main center and places it in the employee's file. Deficiency is now compliant.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (c) staff member records that include (vii) a copy of a valid first aid certificate and a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation certificate for each administrator and educator.	24(1)(c)(vii)	Nov 30, 2025	
Comments: The inspector reviews employee files and observes that one file contains an expired First Aid certificate. The administrator explains that the employee has completed the renewal training; however, a copy of the updated certificate was not yet placed in the file. The operator must ensure that all employee files include current documentation, and that updated certificates.			
28(2) An operator of a licensed facility shall carry out emergency evacuation and fire drills monthly.	28(2)	Nov 30, 2025	
Comments: Inspector verifies the monthly emergency evacuation and fire drills and observes that none were completed for the month of August, September and October. It is recommended to the administrator that 2 separate emergency evacuation and fire drills be completed before the end of November. Operator must ensure emergency evacuation and fire drills are completed monthly to maintain preparedness and to ensure the children's safety.

Comments: Inspector verifies 11 lunchboxes and observes that 2 were missing a label with the child's name. Administrator immediately writes a label with the child's name and places it in the lunchboxes. Deficiency is now compliant			

General Comments

The inspector is onsite to conduct the renewal inspection on a day when children are attending the center for the full day due to school closure. The inspector observes the children engaging in various activities, including lunch, indoor free play featuring gymnastics, magnetic building blocks, physical activity in the gym with a game of ball and arts and crafts. Several children enthusiastically shared their experience participating in a Remembrance Day-themed scavenger hunt held earlier in the morning.

The inspector has a discussion with the administrator in regard to a life-threatening allergy that is clearly posted in a visible and prominent location within the center. Upon reviewing the child's profile inspector notices that the allergy is not documented, and the profile indicates that no EpiPen was required when the center does have an EpiPen onsite. The operator must ensure that all children's profiles are regularly reviewed and updated to reflect any changes, particularly regarding medical and emergency information.

The ratio is respected during the length of the renewal inspection.
