Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector finds that daily activities are not deliberately planned in both classrooms and that documentation of daily activities is missing. The administrator must ensure that programming is deliberately planned and documented.			
24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (b) child records that include: (ii) the name, address and telephone number of the child's medical practitioner.	24(1)(b)(ii)	Oct 14, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that the name, address and telephone number of the child's medical practitioner was missing in one of the eight files verified. The child's file must include the name, address and telephone number of their medical practitioner.			
25 An operator of a licensed facility shall post in a clearly visible and prominent place on the premises: (a) the daily routine.	25(a)	Oct 12, 2022	Oct 11, 2022
Comments: During the inspection, the inspector observed that the daily routine was not posted in the facility. The educator posted the daily routine in a visible and prominent place in the facility when the inspector was on-site. Deficiency is now compliant.			
33(2) Stationary equipment in the outdoor play area shall be surrounded by a protective surfacing and installed according to the manufacturer's instructions.	33(2)	Oct 14, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that the protective surfacing around the dome was not sufficient. The administrator must ensure to maintain adequate depth of protective surfacing around the dome as prescribed by the manufacturer's manual.			
39(2) A licensed facility shall have a separate locked storage space that is inaccessible to the children for each of the following: (a) toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies;	39(2)(a)	Oct 11, 2022	
Comments: During the inspection, the inspector observed a 3.78 liters bottle of Mr. Clean in an unlocked cupboard and a spray bottle filled with Mr. Clean and water solution located inside one of the classrooms which were both accessible to children. Cleaning products should be locked up and inaccessible to children.			
39(2) A licensed facility shall have a separate locked storage space that is inaccessible to the children for each of the following: (b) medications.	39(2)(b)	Oct 11, 2022

Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector noticed prescribed medication in an unlocked fridge located inside one of the classroom, the inspector also observed Ibuprofen and Acetaminophen in an unlocked cupboard inside the same classroom. The administrator must ensure that all medication is stored out of reach of the children and that medications are always locked.			
45(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall require a parent or guardian of a child receiving services at the licensed facility to (b) indicate whether the absence is due to illness or otherwise.	45(1)(b)	Oct 12, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that the reason for the child's absence was not being documented on the daily attendance sheets. The administrator must ensure that the reason for the absence is indicated on the daily attendance sheet..			
48(2) An operator of a licensed facility may supply food to a child receiving services at the licensed facility that a parent or guardian of the child brings from the child's home if the food is labelled with the child's name and refrigerated, as required.	48(2)	Oct 14, 2022	
Comments: During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed that 7 out of 16 lunchboxes were not labeled with the children's names. All food brought from home must be labeled with the child's name.

During the renewal inspection, the inspector observed outdoor free play and snack time. The ratio was respected during the inspection.
