Comments: Licensing observed that the Potential Illness form was not filled out on the day of the inspection when a child (ren) was sent home due to illness. Discussed with onsite Administrator during inspection.			

General Comments
A renewal inspection was conducted during both the morning and afternoon. The inspection focused on the preschool portion of the license, as the school-age program is not currently in operation. During the inspection, discussions took place between Licensing and the Administrator regarding Board of Directors requirements. The Administrator was reminded that at least 20% of Board members must be parents, in accordance with licensing requirements. Children were observed participating in activities both indoors and outdoors throughout the inspection. Educators shared that the children had created a garden and had been enjoying outdoor play, including use of a sprinkler during the warm summer weather. Licensing observed documentation displayed throughout the learning environment, including photographs and learning stories depicting children engaged in a variety of experiences such as fort building, creating a flower garden, participating in alphabet games, constructing with Lego, and making creations with playdough. During the lunch period, educators were observed sitting with the children and engaging them in meaningful conversations, supporting positive social interactions and relationship building. During the rest period, children who chose to nap were provided with the opportunity to do so in accordance with their individual needs and routines. Children who did not require rest were engaged in developmentally appropriate activities in the gymnasium under the supervision of an educator. Positive child guidance techniques were observed throughout the inspection. Educators responded to children in a respectful and supportive manner, promoting a positive learning environment and supporting children's emotional well-being.
