There needs to be a reduction in staff rotation in the classrooms to allow for more stability, consistency for the children, learning and programming.

The Silly Street room did not have any arts supplies for the children, and this must be added and displayed in a way that is visible and accessible to the children. There were also many music instruments added in all rooms.

Comments: Again, today there was very little positive interaction between the staff and the children. The staff are more often observed ordering the children around by saying things such has "stop" "no" "don't do that". One staff member was observed walking around the classrooms all day with his jacket on and at one point he also had his backpack on. He was asked by the inspector to remove his backpack and interact and engage with the children. Staff must be present with the children; they must also present themselves in a way that indicates their desire to be there, and they must also engage with the children and have conversations with them.

All rooms must provide a nap/rest period. If children don't sleep, they should still be provided with mats and a quiet period. The Kindergarten Crossing room did not have any mats out nor an obvious quiet period. The lights were turned off while the children were still eating. If the lights are being turned off before children are done eating, then appropriate lighting needs to be provided to the children so they can see their food. Also, once nap/quiet time was over, the children and some staff yelled loudly" yeeeeee" and raised their hands in their air. It was extremely loud, and some young children were still sleeping. to ensure the safety of the children. Comments: Rooms were cleaned. Walls were painted. The soiled interlocking mats were removed. Carpets were steam cleaned. The toys and shelves were cleaned and reorganized. Despite the changes above, there are still outstanding items: The entrance area of the centre near the cubbies must be cleaned and decluttered. Bags and boxes removed. The floors need to be deep cleaned and all green tap removed. There is still a strong smell coming from the bathroom in the infant room. The toilet does not appear to have a seal and isn't secured to the floor and that may be the cause of the smell. The smell must be rectified. There is still an ongoing smell in the other bathrooms, this may be also caused by the toilets or proper garbage cans need to be provided to lock in the smell. Must clean under carpets and behind and around toys and shelves also. The large black cabinet in Kindergarten Crossing must be kept organized or must be removed. There was still a large amount of clutter on top. There are latches hanging on the side of the brown shelves that need to be removed as they can pose a risk of injury. The protective base around the pole in Kindergarten Crossing needs to be repaired, it's currently being held by tape. The ceiling vents must be cleaned. The infant table needs to be replaced as its cracked with build up dirt and it's unsanitary. Must clean under the change mat in the infant room. Tables need to be cleaned after meals and the children's food put away. One room left the children's lunch boxes open and the table and floor dirty after lunch and did not clean up until later when the children were sleeping. Another group left lunch boxes open on the table and went outside. The highchair in the infant room needs to be deep cleaned.
