Comments:	Ensure resources are brought outside to expand on curriculum areas. For example, information books paper, and writing materials can allow children to look up interests such as bugs and document their own images and thoughts.				

General Comments

When licensing staff arrived, the staff-to-child ratio was met in each room. The monitoring inspection was completed to follow-up on non-compliances noted on previous monitoring inspections. The educators mentioned they were asked to create a list of needed resources for each classroom but as of yet, they have not received them. Each room and the outdoor space are lacking resources to support curriculum and engage children. As the environment is the third teacher, ensuring that the curriculum areas are represented and there are enough resources in the space is critical.

Educators shared with licensing staff their weekly plans showing purposeful planning and documentation posted throughout the rooms. The educator and inclusion support worker in the three-year-old room were excited to share their plans on "visiting" different countries on a "plane" and learning about cultures, dress, and customs. Discussions with each educator regarding curriculum included providing more open-ended activities and documenting learning in multiple ways such as photos, quotes, learning stories, webbing, etc. Educators mentioned not having a way to take photos all the time as they have to ask the administrator to take photos. It is important for educators to have access to a device/camera to take photos at all times to capture moments of learning.
