General Comments

When licensing staff arrived, children were finishing up snack and a child from the four-year-old room was being moved into the three-year-old room due to the small number of children. The educator in the four-year-old took the time to plan curriculum with no children present. The educator in the three-year-old room provided playdough and materials for children on two tables however, there was not enough playdough for every child. There were two pairs of scissors and children kept asking when they could use them. A discussion with the educator spoke about the importance of pre-planning curriculum and ensuring there is sufficient resources for all the children in the room. The importance of documentation was also discussed as the educator stated they are still working on it. There was evidence of activities with paint posted on the wall and a fall craft with colored pieces of paper including two trays of fall items such as pumpkins, logs, and pinecones.

Children in the two-year-old room and infants were outside on the playground this morning. Some care will need

to be taken in the spring to the outdoor play space including wood mulch to be raked, additional sand added to the sand box, and the shade to be secured in the infant area.

The bookshelves were reviewed by licensing staff and additional texts need to be added to support children's literate identities. Be sure that a variety of texts are available such as counting books, narratives, informational books, rhyme, repetition, alphabet, poetry, song books, and child created texts. While purposefully planning environments, educators can consider what texts can support their invitations and provocations and connect to children's interests, passions, abilities, and experiences.
