General Comments
<p>As I visited each classroom, the first thing that was noticeable were the defined centres and that many more materials were added to the environment. This includes cars, trains, musical instruments, blocks, lego, magnetics, books, puzzles, dolls, dramatic play areas with kitchens. Licensing staff recommend that some of the educators set up invitations for play in the different centres, ensure materials are organized and prepared for the beginning of each day. Also, as the children age up, more art materials should be accessible to the children such as playdough, safety scissors, white glue, etc..</p> <p>Licensing staff discussed pre-planned programming with both the educators and the administrator. Through conversations with the educators, they were able to articulate how their activities are based off of the children's interests however the connection between the children's interests, the facility's planning sheets and learning stories is not quite clear. Educators should start using a method to pre-plan their program such as webbing or journaling to help demonstrate that planning is a process that involves engaging the children and reflecting on their interests, passions, strengths and abilities. Licensing staff advised the administrator that she would reach out to the curriculum team to see if they have any other recommendations.</p> <p>Learning stories, pictures of the children, and the children's artwork are some of the methods that the educators are using for documentation. Some of it is presented in frames and is posted both in the classroom and the hallways.</p> <p>Attendance records, infant toddler sheets, medication records, incident records, fire drill records, child files and staff files were organized and complete.</p> <p>The operator should start considering winter materials for the outdoor play space. The educators should ensure that the materials get stored properly so they do not get snow and ice covered and become unusable or broken.</p> <p>The educators were engaged with the children. They redirect as needed and comfort children who appear upset or in need of more attention. Please ensure transition times of children are shortened when preparing for</p>

outside. In the younger classrooms where there are two teachers, one of the educators could take the children who are ready outside. This will prevent escalating behaviours and stop the children from getting overheated.

I can now recommend facility for licensing.
