General Comments

Upon Licensing staff arrival, the children were finishing their snacks. The entry way was bright, and children's belongings were organized on hooks with their names. The parent boards were neat and contained all required documentation. The monthly fire drill for November was completed and logged and allergies were posted. As a reminder, please update my contact information on the posted sheet.

Each room had art projects and learning stories hanging on the wall as well as large cabinets of art supplies. Play material such as play kitchens, open ended toys, dinosaurs, blocks, cars, trucks, dramatic play costumes, and books were in each room. As a reminder, please replace ripped or torn books. The 2-year-old and 2/3-year-old room had sensory play pools with rice or seeds and the 4-year-old room has an indoor sandbox with tires, trucks, and pots and pans.

Later in the morning, the 2-year-old and 4-year-old rooms were busy making snowmen crafts. Educators were observed helping the children with the glue and kind words such as "Amazing job" and "I love all your snowmen" were heard. After crafts, the 2/3 room and 4-year-old room went outside to play in the snow. Educators were observed helping the children get their winter outdoor wear and using a walking lead while crossing the parking lot together. The outdoor play space is large and fully fenced. Play material such as colourful tires, a wooden playhouse and play climber with a slide, and trucks were in good condition. Educators were spread out and maintained clear lines of sight and were observed playing with the children.
