General Comments

Licensing Staff arrived at the facility to perform a Monitoring Inspection. Upon arrival, children were slowly arriving at the facility for morning drop off. To celebrate March Break, each day has a different theme. Today the children were excited to partake in "Crazy Hair Day". The Educators greeted the families at the door and children were signed into attendance as they arrived.

The flow of the morning routine was smooth. Tabletop activities were set up for the children as they arrived. In one room, a beach themed sensory bin was set up. The bin contained pieces of blue construction paper. blue tissue paper. plastic sea animals, rocks and chickpeas. At another table, an Educator had made Playdoh and added sand into it. Gems, seashells, rolling pins and plastic sea animals were also set out at the table.

The rooms took turns washing hands for morning snack. In each room, one Educator was observed taking a small group to the bathroom, while the other Educator sanitized the tables and tidied the room in preparation for snack time. Due to the rain and icy conditions, the children stayed inside after snack. In the 2-year-old and 4-year-old classroom, furniture was moved so the children could safely engage in gross motor movements such as dancing and parachute games.

Fire drills are posted and are up to date. A gentle reminder was given on site to ensure in the infant room that they have access to paper so they can engage in mark making activities. The Educators were attentive to the needs of the children during today's Monitoring Inspection. Educators were observed sitting on the ground with the children reading books, dancing with them and using positive words of encouragement. A new infant has joined this week. The Educators were observed offering hugs, holding the infant's hand and rubbing their back
