| Club Room: Outdoors, the children were observed playing baseball and using the playground equipment. Indoors, the children were engaged in building with blocks, playing Tic Tac Toe with their educator, and participating in open-ended art. The educators indicated the children are currently showing an interest in sports. | | | | | | |
| Preschool Room: The children were observed playing on the playground equipment and observing slugs in a bug enclosure outdoors. Indoors, they were observed transitioning to outdoor play, during which educators applied sunscreen. Educators reported that the children are currently interested in bugs, open-ended art, toy cars, and spending time outdoors. | | | | | | |
