Comments: Health Canada states that playpens are not intended to be used for unsupervised sleep as they do not meet the same safety requirements and are not as durable as cribs, therefore playpens are not recommended for unsupervised sleep of children even if 15 minute checks are being done.			
39(2) A licensed facility shall have a separate locked storage space that is inaccessible to the children for each of the following: (a) toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies;	39(2)(a)	Feb 03, 2021	
Comments: All cleaning supplies (toxic products) need to be stored behind a door or cabinet that is locked and not accessible to children.			

<p>General Comments</p> <p>When licensing staff arrived at the Early Learning and Childcare Home the Operator screened her for Covid-19.</p> <p>Upon arrival at the ELCH the Operator was engaging in a colouring activity with the children. During my visit it was observed that the Operator was very kind and loving towards the children.</p> <p>While inspecting the lower level play space the Operator showed licensing staff plants that the children and Operator planted the previous day as they are exploring the properties of grains and plants. Licensing staff also observed many examples of children's learning as the Operator had pictures on the wall for the children to revisit the learning experience.</p> <p>At the time of inspection licensing staff asked the Operator if parents were permitted inside the home (pre-Covid) the Operator replied that the parents of the children she cares for are encouraged to enter the home as well as take part in field trips with the children. This is awesome to hear.</p> <p>During the licensing inspection it was noted that an infant was napping in a playpen located on the upper level of the home. Licensing staff informed the Operator that the playpen the infant naps in will need to be moved to</p>

the same level of the home where the Operator is during nap time, as per Canada Consumer Product Safety and Regulations. Another option would be to purchase a crib and baby monitor, as well as, continuing to do fifteen minute checks on the infant to ensure the safety of the infant napping on the upper level of the home.

It was also noted that the cleaning supplies are located on the upper level of the home but not stored in a locked cabinet or locked room. The cleaning supplies and other toxic materials will need to be locked in a cabinet or a lock will need to be put on the laundry room door to ensure that the children do not have access to these products.
