Comments:	Children in the outdoor play environment behind the school not provided with materials to engage with apart from the fixed equipment present. Chalk, balls, skipping ropes, etc. are materials that should be provided daily for children to engage with when in this outdoor play area.						

General Comments

During today's monitoring inspection, children were engaged in play in the indoor and outdoor play environments. In the indoor environment, educators were observed seated with children engaged in play and conversation.

Discussed requirement with staff onsite to provide an engaging environment for the children with a variety of materials and invitations to play set up in preparation for their arrival.

Materials were provided at the tables, however bins remained with lids on, folding shelves with materials were not available or accessible. Recommendation was made to provide a shelf for each bubble grouping with a variety of materials that could be set up and accessible for the children each day along with setting up invitations on each table.

Also discussed requirement for a purposefully planned and documented program, and recommendation was made to provide a binder for each group where educators can document the invitations that were provided and activities that children participated in. This will support educators in continuing to plan for the children and extend and build on ideas and interests. Licensing staff will review these binders during visits to ensure the regulation is being met.

Two children were engaged in play with the play food and dishes. They were playing restaurant and inviting their educator to order and get the food they prepared. QA Monitor discussed with educators ways to support and extend this play by providing mark making tools and paper for the children to create menus, adding a tray so that food can be delivered, and having a cash register. So many opportunities to extend and build learning are possible.
