An inspection of the outdoor play environment did not find any non-compliance or area of concern. Educators were reminded to ensure they are raking the mulch under swings and equipment to the appropriate depth.

QA Monitor discussed with staff the importance of spreading themselves out so that they could engage with children in play and adequately supervise children as they play throughout the playground.
