Documentation has been posted on the walls (ex: animals of the forest and parts of nature). If this is the children's current interest, what could be added to support this? Items that could be added but are not limited to include: objects from nature like stones, moss, leaves, realistic animals figurines, etc. Educators should be adding materials and accessories to the environment based on the children's current interests and setting up invitations for the children to explore daily.

General Comments

Completed renewal inspection today. Children were returning from a morning walk in their wagons upon inspector's arrival. Hand washing and diaper changing procedures were observed. Educators are currently updating hand made laminated books for individual children with photos.

Documentation binder was reviewed at time of inspection. The binder demonstrated that shadows and growing vegetables/fruits were some of the recent topics of interest in the past.

The children were observed eating lunch and also transitioning into their rest time routine. It is recommended that educators sit with the children at their level during snack and lunch time to model healthy meal time routines.

Recommended moving diaper changing procedures or printing on different colored paper to make this more prominent as it is currently blending in on the bulletin board.

There is currently one child who has a medical condition that requires medication not be locked up.

Recommended that the parent complete Essential Routine Services Plan and that this be kept with the medication (not locked, but out of children's reach). Document was provided to educator to give to parent.

General Comments							
Entrance area was cluttered with materials and equipment today. Ensure this area is kept tidy and free of clutter/obstructions going forward. Educators were observed reading children books and responding to children's initiations for materials or needs. Recommended that equipment and bins are flipped at end of day to prevent the accumulation of standing water.							
Exemption request has been discussed with administrator for financial records. To be submitted as soon as possible.
