| Comments: The Inspector observed that a Potential Illness Form and a Return from Exclusion Form were not signed by parents in instances where a child was sent home due to illness and upon the child's return to care.<br><br>These forms are required to be completed in full, including the parent's signature, to ensure accurate documentation and compliance with program requirements |              |                      |                |

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| <p>An annual renewal inspection was conducted today. Upon arrival at the childcare facility, the inspector observed the children finishing their morning snack and preparing for outdoor play.</p> <p>Throughout the inspection, educators were observed meeting the needs of the children by ensuring appropriate handwashing, diaper-changing, and feeding routines were consistently followed.</p> <p>During outdoor play, children were observed engaging in a variety of age-appropriate activities, including scooping and digging in the sandbox, playing in the playhouse, rolling child-sized rubber tires to educators, and crawling on the grass and ground. Educators were attentive and provided support and supervision as needed, particularly when children were navigating the steps from the deck to the ground and when entering and exiting the sandbox.</p> |

## General Comments

The inspector reviewed all operator, staff, and children's files. All files were verified and found to contain the required documentation.

Documentation displayed throughout the facility, as well as within the children's portfolio binders, reflected the children's activities and learning experiences. Evidence included photographs of children participating in sensory exploration activities outdoors using flowers and natural materials on the shaded deck, dancing and bubble play, puppet activities, outdoor story time, painting experiences, and water play.

Upon returning indoors from outdoor play and prior to lunch, the inspector observed that two children had fallen asleep. Discussions were held with the on-site Administrator and educators regarding the timing of lunch. Reference was made to the Operator's Manual for Full-Time and Part-Time Early Learning and Childcare, which states that the daily program should remain flexible to "accommodate the changing needs of an infant."

It was discussed that moving the children's lunch time to 11:00 a.m. may better support the children's needs, particularly when transitioning from outdoor play to lunch and subsequently to nap/quiet time. This adjustment may help reduce instances of children falling asleep before lunch due to fatigue.

Further discussions were held regarding the posted daily schedule, which currently includes specific times for each activity. The inclusion of fixed times may limit flexibility and responsiveness to the individual needs of the children if educators feel compelled to adhere strictly to the schedule. Licensing recommends revising the daily schedule to remove specific times, allowing educators greater flexibility to adjust routines based on the needs and interests of the children throughout the day.

The inspector observed diaper-changing and handwashing procedures being carried out appropriately and consistently on multiple occasions during the inspection.

Throughout the renewal inspection, educators were observed providing attentive and responsive care. They engaged with children at their level during play and learning experiences and communicated with them in a kind, respectful, and developmentally appropriate manner.
