Children and educators observed engaged in a variety of activities this morning including outdoor play, gross motor play on the indoor field, songs, dramatic play and fine motor play. Educators observed at the children's level engaging in meaningful conversations and play.						
Each learning environment has documentation and materials that support the children's current interests (birds, feathers, clapping, climbing, construction, trains and first responders). Photos of the children, children's words, and learning stories are displayed in a way that allows children to revisit their experiences.						
A small indoor climbing structure has been purchased for the twos room. Ensure manufacturer's assembly instructions are reviewed and followed before the structure is added to the environment. Discussed with supervisor on site during Monitoring Inspection, as some of the ropes appear to be too long.
