Monitoring Inspection completed today with a focus on School-Age Program. QA Monitor also followed up on previous orders for compliance in the Infant Room and Two's Room.

## Multi-Purpose Room (School-Age):

Children and educators observed engaged in a variety activities including air hockey, board games, drawing, and block play this afternoon. Educators observed engaging in conversations with children about their day. Purposeful planning is evident within the indoor play area through invitations, documentation and materials that have been added to the environment. Documentation and materials support the children's current interests in board games, gym games and challenges.
