General Comments

Upon Licensing staff arrival for the renewal inspection, the Operator was welcoming, and the children were playing together in the main room.

The stairway and main room were inviting with children's artwork and current learning stories on display. Play material such as wooden blocks, magnet tiles, a basket of cars, sensory play toys and dramatic play costumes were organized and age appropriate. There were plenty of books organized on a shelf and a large art table with markers and sheets of paper. Before morning snack, proper handwashing and diaper changing procedures were observed.

While the Operator prepared snack, the children chose books from a basket and read together at the table. A quick tidy up time was given before snack was served. The daily snack menu posted in the stairway corresponded to today's snack. Today, the children had homemade waffles with syrup, banana pieces and raspberries. The Operator was observed sitting with the children and was actively engaged in conversation. After snack, hands and faces were washed, music was played, and the children were observed dancing together while the Operator cleaned up dishes and wiped the table off. There were many laughs and giggles heard throughout the morning and the transition to outdoor time was smooth.

The outdoor play area was fully fenced. Play material such as a mud kitchen, wooden playhouse, balls and wall hanging activities were in good condition. Children were observed playing on a small slide and using a push bike on the pathways throughout the space prior to going for a walk to the nearby wooded area and park. While in the wooded area, a safety check was observed, and the children pretended to roast marshmallows. The Operator was observed asking the children questions about squirrels. Before leaving, the children gathered sticks to paint.

Once back, the children hung up their outdoor wear and were excited to paint their sticks from the woods. While painting, the Operator was heard offering positive words of encouragement and praise such as "great job!" and "so nice!". While the children were finishing up their painting, the Operator set up nap cots and a crib. Before lunch, the children washed their hands and went upstairs. During lunch, again the children sat together, and the Operator was engaged in conversation with the children. There was evidence of daily routine as each transition
