Comments: While taking the ratio, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed infants mixed in a preschool class. Infants can only be mixed with preschool-age children outside the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The educator took the infants into their classroom. Deficiency is now compliant.

Comments: In 2 child records files verified, the emergency contact information is incomplete. All child records must contain the name, address, and telephone number of at least 2 emergency contacts in case the parents can't be reached. The administrator must ensure that all child profiles are complete. In 1 child record file verified, the complete address for the 2-contact information was missing. All child records must include the name, address, and telephone number of at least 2 emergency contacts in case the parents can't be reached. The administrator must ensure that all child profiles are complete.

Comments: In 1 child's record file verified, the copy of the immunization record or a copy of an exemption is missing. All child records must include a copy of the immunization record or a copy of the exemption. The administrator must ensure that all child records are complete.

<p>Comments: In 1 staff member's verified record, the training qualification certificate and diploma were missing. All staff members records must include the training qualification certificates and diplomas. The certificate for the completion of the introduction to ECE was sent by email to the Quality Assurance Monitor while on site to conduct the renewal inspection. A copy was placed in the staff's file. Deficiency is now compliant.</p>

<p>Comments: In 1 staff member's record, the copy of the Social Development check is expired. A new copy was sent by email to the responsible on site while the Quality Assurance Monitor was conducting the renewal inspection and placed in the staff member's record. Deficiency is now compliant.</p>			
28(2) An operator of a licensed facility shall carry out emergency evacuation and fire drills monthly.	28(2)	Sep 12, 2025	
<p>Comments: The Quality Assurance Monitor observed that the monthly emergency evacuation and fire drills were not completed for one month during the renewal period. Monthly emergency evacuation and fire drills must be completed. The Quality Assurance Monitor asked that 2 emergency evacuation and fire drills be completed for one month before the end of the renewal year, which is in September.</p>			
31(5.1) The outdoor play area of a full-time or part-time early learning and childcare centre shall include a shaded area of at least 0.45 m2 for each child that can be accommodated in the outdoor play area as provided under subparagraph 4(1)(g)(ii)	31(5.1)	Aug 15, 2025	
<p>Comments: The Quality Assurance Monitor observed in the infant outdoor play area that the shaded tarp was broken. The person responsible on site informed the Quality Assurance Monitor that the tarp was broken during the last wind and rainstorm. The outdoor play area must have 0.45m2 of shade for each child based on the maximum number of children that can be accommodated in the outdoor play area. The person responsible on site informed the Quality Assurance Monitor that another surface to provide shade will be bought in the upcoming weeks.</p>			
33(3) An operator of a licensed facility shall complete a monthly review and maintenance plan on all stationary equipment that includes the following information: (a) the review and repair dates; (b) the action required and the action taken; and (c) the name of the staff member who conducted the review.	33(3)	Aug 05, 2025	
<p>Comments: The Quality Assurance Monitor was not able to observe the monthly review and maintenance plan of the stationary equipment for the current renewal year. A monthly review and maintenance plan must be completed on all stationary equipment showing: the review and repair dates; the action required and taken; and the name of the staff completing the review.</p>			
39(2) A licensed facility shall have a separate locked storage space that is inaccessible to the children for each of the following: (a) toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies;	39(2)(a)	Jul 29, 2025	Jul 29, 2025
<p>Comments: The Quality Assurance Monitor observed in one of the classrooms more than one bottle of bug spray that was not locked. The Quality Assurance Monitor also observed in the washroom a storage area with an unlocked door that had Lysol Wipes and Lysol toilet bowl cleaner. Toxic products, chemical products, and cleaning supplies must be locked and inaccessible to children. Because the door could not be locked, the toxic products were moved to the designated locked area with the bug spray. The deficiency is now compliant.</p>			
47(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall refuse admission to a child if satisfactory proof of the immunizations required by the Public Health Act or the regulations under that Act is not provided.	47(1)	Aug 08, 2025	
<p>Comments: In 1 child record file verified, the copy of immunization or a copy of the exemption is missing. All children must have proof of immunizations or an exemption prior to the child's entry.</p>			

General Comments

The Quality Assurance Monitor is on site to complete the renewal inspection.

While verifying the children's file, the QAM observed in one child's profile one allergy and one intolerance listed in the allergy section. The person responsible on site informed the QAM that the child in question is no longer

allergic or intolerant to these two foods listed in his child's profile. The QAM informed the person responsible on site to ask the parents to write in the child's profile, in the allergy section, that this no longer applies to the child and have the parents initial.

The QAM observed in a classroom three soothers for the same child that were labeled with the child's name but were only placed on a shelf with no storage method. The QAM recommended to the staff to place the soothers in a ziplock bag to avoid contamination with bacteria.

It was also noted that three eligible staff members had not yet completed their required 10 professional learning (PL) hours; however, they have until September 31 to meet this requirement. The administrator may inform the QAM once all eligible staff have completed their PL hours.

The QAM also inquired about the renewal application. The person responsible on site informed the QAM that the renewal application was sent to the wrong address. The QAM asked for a paper copy, but it was not available on site. The QAM asked for the application to be mailed to the correct address and suggested it can also be brought in person at the Early Learning And Childcare office.

The QAM observed the children eating their morning snack (lunch box) and then transitioning to the outdoor play area. The children were also observed transitioning to lunch time (lunch box) and then to nap time. The educators were observed reading books to the children and singing songs. Positive interactions were observed between the educators and the children.
