General Comments

A monitoring inspection took place on May 9, 2024, in the morning. During the visit, children were observed engaging in indoor free play. Proper handwashing procedures were observed during snack time, demonstrating a commitment to hygiene and health. Additionally, steps or platforms were provided to enable children to access regular-sized toilets or sinks, promoting independence and safety within the facility.

Educators were noted for their use of positive language and gentle reminders, fostering a supportive atmosphere for the children. Furthermore, a notice informing parents about the presence of a communicable disease was prominently displayed, emphasizing transparency and proactive communication regarding children's health and safety.

The setup of the room was inviting, with materials displayed at eye level to encourage exploration and engagement. A varied supply of appropriate equipment, materials, books, and toys was available, ensuring that children had diverse opportunities for play and learning. The facility offered both individual and group experiences, catering to different preferences and promoting social interaction among the children.

Throughout the facility, several forms of documentation were observed, providing valuable insights into each child's development journey and progress. Overall, the monitoring inspection highlighted the facility's dedication to creating a nurturing and stimulating environment for the children under their care.
