## **General Comments**

A Monitoring Inspection occurred October 7, 2025

The children were observed in the indoor and outdoor environments, including transitions between the two.

Educators are to review Section 8.2 Child Guidance in the Operator's Manual.

The children were observed outdoors using the swings, playing on the seesaw, playing with the trucks in the sand, and going down the slide.

## **General Comments**

Indoors, the children were observed washing hands, sitting at the table while an educator read a story, coloring on coffee filters, and playing with alphabet blocks.

Diaper changing procedures were observed. The changing area is located a meter or less from a sink. Diaper changing procedures are posted and visible to those completing a diaper change.

Several forms of documentation were visible in the indoor environment. These included learning stories, learning webs, photographs, and children's artwork.

A clearly visible and prominent area is designated for posting the facility's license, current monitoring reports, and any orders for compliance. Additional documentation observed included daily attendance records, staff files, and records of evacuation and monthly fire drills.

A conversation took place with the administrators regarding the following:

- Educators to ensure they are following diaper-changing procedures. It is recommended that all educators review Section 10.3: Diaper Changing in the Operator Manual.
- Diaper-changing tables are accumulating dirt and must be cleaned and maintained regularly.
- Educators are to ensure that climbing structures have clear safety zones (e.g., a minimum 6-foot clearance around structures).
- Protective surfacing material is to be used as a ground cover within the safety zone of play area equipment, as specified by the CSA standard.
- Educators are to ensure acrylic paint is inaccessible to the children.
- Educators to ensure documentation is updated and reflects current practices.
- Administrators are to ensure Early Childhood Education certificates are added to staff files for those who have completed them.
