Monitoring Inspection:

Infant Room:

Children and educators observed engaged in outdoor play this morning. Educators observed comforting children when upset. The infant environment is set-up with a variety of materials, that are displayed in an inviting way at the children's level.

Two/Three:

Children and educators observed during transition times, indoor play and outdoor play. Educators were engaged at the children's level during outdoor play. A variety of documentation is posted throughout the learning environment that supports the children's current interests and learning experiences. QA Monitor discussed room layout ideas with site supervisor.

Next steps:

- focus on setting up purposefully planned invitations throughout the environment
- indoor play area remove excess materials and display materials in a way that is inviting on the shelves

Preschool:

Children and educator observed during transition times and outdoor play this morning. Educator was observed to actively engage children during transition times. Educator and children observed engaging in meaningful conversations during outdoor play. Educator was observed discussing spider webs with children and adding information and open-ended questions to the conversation.

The indoor play area is set-up with a variety of materials. Books are displayed throughout the environment that support the children's current interests. The Tuff Tray Table is set up as a pretend "Frog Habitat" that the children have had the opportunity to add materials to expand the habitat.

Next steps:

- outdoor "hide-out" how can you make this area inviting? (example dramatic play, mark making, cozy area, art area, etc.)
- indoor play area remove excess materials and display materials in a way that is inviting on the shelves
