Comments: 1 out of 8 child record verified didn't have the address of the 2 emergency contact. Every child record should include the name, address and telephone number of at least 2 emergency contacts.

Comments: The Quality Assurance Monitor observed that in an unlocked cabinet there was 8 bottles of shaving cream. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the educator that all toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies should be locked and inaccessible to children. The educator immediately locked the cabinet. The Quality Assurance Monitor observed that a bottle of cleaning supply (On the mark \ Strongarm that is labelled keep out of reach of children) was left in the play area on a higher shelf where some older children could have access to it. The Quality Assurance Monitor asked the educator and administrator to store the product in a locked place. The operator put the cleaning supply away and locked it up. Deficiency is now compliant

<p>Comments: The Quality Assurance Monitor arrived on site and asked the educator how many children the educator had. The educator replied that there were 8 children and that one should arrive shortly. When the Quality Assurance Monitor counted the children, the Quality Assurance Monitor counted 9 children. The Quality Assurance Monitor asked to see the attendance sheet, all 9 children were marked in.</p> <p>While on site the Quality Assurance Monitor noticed a child in the gym area alone lifting weights. The Quality Assurance Monitor told the educator that the child shouldn't be in the gym area alone with no supervision lifting weights. The educator asked the child to step out of the gym and make his way outside with the rest of the children.</p> <p>The Quality Assurance Monitor noticed another group of children got at the centre, so the Quality Assurance Monitor went to ask the educator again how many children there was. The educator said 15, the Quality Assurance Monitor counted 21. The Quality Assurance Monitor told the educator the 21 children were counted. The educator told the Quality Assurance Monitor that the operator's daughter is there, but they count her in the ratio. The Quality Assurance Monitor asked how old the child was and made it clear that if the child is 12 and under the child must count in the ratio and must be added to the attendance sheet.</p> <p>The Quality Assurance Monitor had a discussion with the operator in concerns of the ratio during the visit. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the importance of the educators knowing how many children they have all the time. The Quality Assurance Monitor also explained to the operator that his daughter must be added to the attendance sheet and the educators must count her in the ratio. The Quality Assurance Monitor also had a discussion regarding the child that was left unsupervised in the gym area. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the operator that this section of the building was not approved by licensing to have children in this area, no children should be playing in this area, the Quality Assurance Monitor told the operator if he wants to start using this area for the daycare, he will have to send in change in service application to add the room.</p> <p>Deficiency is now compliant</p>
