Comments: During the follow-up inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed that while the garbage in the trailer and the broken gym equipment had been removed from the outdoor play area, and the railing on the stairs had been repaired, some garbage remained on the ground. Additionally, the play structure must either be removed or blocked off unless a protective surface is added. This serves as a fourth reminder to ensure the outdoor play area is safe and free of hazards.

Comments: During the follow-up inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed that there is insufficient shade in the outdoor play area. This serves as a third reminder that additional shade must be provided to ensure the area is safe and comfortable for children during outdoor activities.

Comments: During the follow up inspection the Quality Assurance Monitor noted that there was an insufficient number of materials available for the children. The materials observed included some LEGO blocks, a limited selection of arts and crafts supplies, a few books, a small number of board games, and some bracelet-making materials. This serves as a fourth reminder that additional materials must be added to the indoor play area to ensure all children are engaged and have access to meaningful activities.

Comments: During the follow up inspection the Quality Assurance Monitor observed that most materials were stored in closed filing cabinets, which were not easily accessible to the children. Some of the cabinets were also difficult to open. This serves as a fourth reminder that all materials must be stored on low, open shelves to ensure they are easily accessible to children.

Comments: During the follow up inspection the Quality Assurance Monitor observed that the outdoor play area did not contain an adequate amount of play materials for children. This serves as a fourth reminder that additional materials must be added to support children's engagement and development.

General Comments

The Quality Assurance Monitor was on site to conduct a follow-up inspection.

Throughout the visit, child-to-staff ratios were maintained.

During the inspection, children were observed eating their snack. However, it was noted that handwashing was not performed prior to eating.

The Importance of Handwashing in Childcare Settings

Handwashing is a fundamental infection prevention measure in educational childcare services. Given the constant close contact between children, their developing immune systems, and their exploratory behaviors, the risk of microorganism transmission is particularly high.

To ensure a healthy and safe environment, it is essential that educators strictly follow hand hygiene protocols, in accordance with standards established by public health authorities. It is also crucial that educators ensure children wash their hands properly.

Handwashing helps to:

- •Reduce the spread of pathogens responsible for common infectious diseases such as respiratory infections, gastroenteritis, and skin conditions.
- •Protect the health of children, staff, and families by limiting outbreaks.
- •Promote the development of preventive behaviors in children from an early age.
- •Ensure compliance with regulatory requirements regarding sanitation and infection prevention.

Key moments when handwashing should be performed include:

- Before and after meals or snacks
- After using the toilet
- After outdoor activities
- •After coughing, sneezing, or blowing one's nose
- •After contact with soiled surfaces or waste
