<p>Comments: During the renewal inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed that in one of the classrooms, arts and craft materials were not easily accessible to children. The materials were stored in closed shelves , making them out of sight and reach, which limited the opportunities for children to express interest and engaged independently.</p> <p>This observation was shared with the on site administrator, who promptly relocated the materials to a low , open shelf to ensure accessibility. The administrator explained that they believed the educator had temporarily stored the materials while the group was outside. The Quality Assurance Monitor emphasized that arts and craft materials must always remain accessible to children and recommended that they consistently be kept on low, open shelving.</p> <p>Deficiency is now compliant</p>

<p>Comments: During the renewal inspection, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed a bottle of Aleve stored in an unlocked storage space within a classroom. The Quality Assurance Monitor brought this to the attention of the on-site administrator and advised that all medication must be stored in a locked space, regardless of whether it is out of children's reach.</p> <p>The administrator inquired whether locking was necessary if the medication was inaccessible to children. The Quality Assurance Monitor clarified that all medications must be secured in a locked storage at all times. The administrator immediately complied and placed the Aleve in a locked storage area.</p> <p>Later in the inspection the Quality Assurance Monitor noticed that a storage space in the bathroom carrying several bottles of children Tylenol and Bug Spray that was left unlocked with the key in the lock. The Quality Assurance Monitor brought mentioned it to the on-site administrator whom immediately locked the storage space and took the key out of the lock.</p> <p>Later in the inspection , the Quality Assurance Monitor observed that a storage space in the bathroom containing several bottles of children's Tylenol and bug spray was left unlocked , with the key still in the lock. This was brought to the attention of the on-site administrator , who immediately locked the storage and removed the key.</p> <p>Deficiency is now compliant</p>

Comments: During the renewal inspection , the Quality Assurance Monitor observed two infant bottles in the refrigerator that were not covered. This was brought to the attention of the on-site administrator, who began searching for the missing covers. Later in the inspection, the educators responsible for the group located the covers and placed them on the bottles. Deficiency is now compliant			

General Comments
<p>The Quality Assurance Monitor is on site to conduct the renewal inspection. Child to staff ratio is maintained throughout the visit.</p> <p>During the renewal inspection the Quality Assurance Monitor observed children engaged in a variety of activities , including indoor play , outdoor play , lunch , and the beginning of nap time.</p> <p>A discussion regarding professional learning hours was held between the administrator and the Quality Assurance Monitor. The Quality Assurance Monitor noted that five staff members had not yet completed the required 10 hours of professional learning. The administrator was reminded that all staff must complete the appropriate number of professional learning hours based on their time as educators within the renewal period. The Quality Assurance Monitor clarified that the five staff members in question have until the end of the renewal period (July 31st) to complete their hours. This will be verified during the next monitoring inspection.</p>
