## **General Comments**

I signed in upon entry to the building. The center is following all COVID protocols properly. Most of the children were outside when I arrived. They came in for lunch and the transition from outside to inside went smoothly. The staff appear to have a good routine to ease transitions. The younger children were inside doing some free play before their lunch and naps. The program is mainly based on outdoor programming. There are many safety protocols in place for the outdoor environment, including a daily checklist examining the outdoor area, the weather, the safety equipment, as well as precautions to take depending on conditions. The staff appear to be very thorough in ensuring the safety of the children.

The outdoor environment is well organized and is set up into different spaces/centers such as art centers, music, blocks, fire pit, among others. Pathways are kept clear to each space. There is a small building close by in the outdoor area that groups can use for warming up or taking a break from being outside for a while. Every time I visit. I note new things within the environment for the children. The children appeared to be enjoying their time outside.

The indoor environment is clean and bright and has a wide variety of materials for the children to play with. There are learning stories on the wall and I also saw more learning stories that were recently taken down. They are written well. I also looked at a sample of programming being done. The programming is very well done and well thought out. It includes all aspects of learning and play.

The program appeared to be running well on the day of my visit.
