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General Comments Each of the classrooms were engaged in a variety of activities during the visit. The infants had a painting activity. They were painting the sun to go with the butterflies, clouds and raindrops that were already on the wall. Some of the preschool children were making a craft at the table. It was an oceanic theme as the children are preparing for a trip to Saint Andrews in June. Other children were busying playing bowling and jump frog. The two-year-old group were dressed in costumes from the dramatic play area and were starting to get ready for outdoor play time. While outside the children were observed in a variety of activities such as playing in the sandbox, driving the toy cars, digging in the rocks and playing on the climbing structure and slide. A couple of the children were making "flower soup" in sandbox area. Children's artwork is posted throughout the facility. Magnetic walls have been added to the classrooms, which the children seem to be enjoying. Families are represented in the classrooms through a family wall of photos. The educators are preplanning activities on monthly calendar. Documentation is being done in the form of learning stories and webbing. Educators were observed consoling the children after they hurt themselves or were having a difficult moment. Although the bins are labelled in each classroom, I would recommend the educators go to the next step and labelled the bins in the various languages of the children in the facility that why each child/family will be represented through another way in the classroom besides pictures. The black cushion in the reading area of the afterschool room will need to be replaced as it is torn and worn out. During the visit everything seemed to be running well.
