While gathering the child-to-staff ratio in one of the classrooms, the educator mentioned that four-year-olds and school-age children were mixed in that space. However, the Quality Assurance Monitor noticed three children who did not appear to be four years old. Upon inquiry, the educator confirmed that these children were two-year-olds from the toddler room. The Quality Assurance Monitor then asked whether they were the two-year-olds who had not yet transitioned into the appropriate classroom, and the educator confirmed that they were still registered as infants. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the educator that infants cannot be mixed with preschool or schoolage children. Since these children were still classified as infants, they could not remain in the classroom. The Quality Assurance Monitor instructed the educator to transition them back to their appropriate classroom, which was promptly done. Deficiency is now compliant

While gathering the child-to-staff ratio in a classroom, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed an educator with four children in the toddler room. Upon inquiring about their ages, the educator stated that they were two years old. The Quality Assurance Monitor then asked whether these children were the two-year-olds who had not yet transitioned to the designated two-year-old room and were still registered as infants. The educator confirmed that although the children were two years old, they were still classified as infants. The Quality Assurance Monitor reminded the educator that the infant child-to-staff ratio must be followed as long as the children remain registered as infants. Another educator attempted to move one of the children to the two-year-old room, but the Quality Assurance Monitor reiterated that the child could not be mixed with older children due to their infant registration status. As a result, the child remained in the toddler classroom, and an additional educator was brought in to ensure compliance with the required child-to-staff ratio. Deficiency is now compliant
