Comments: Purposefully planned and documented program not evident throughout the learning environments. As per section 7.1 of the Operator Manual, a wide range of opportunities for school age children are provided to allow children to explore new interests and relationships- including but not limited to: team sports, collaborative games, cooking, dramatic play, art, music, games, etc. A written plan ensures that a variety of opportunities are provided for learning and exploration. Weekly programming and daily activity sheets demonstrate that educators are thinking about and considering children's interests and favorite activities as they plan to create a welcoming and engaging environment. Using the plan, educators create invitations and set up the play environment daily ahead of children's arrival with a variety of choice based on their interests.

Comments: Attendance records were left in the indoor play environment when children were engaged in outdoor play. Attendance Records to be taken out of the facility whenever children leave the building.

Comments: Bathroom floor unclean. To be cleaned. Paint chipped on walls in some areas to be repainted.

Comments: Dramatic play materials depleted. Examples of items to add, but not limited to: costumes, hats, scarves, purses, office supplies, restaurant items, clipboards, cash register, money, pretend food, real life items, loose parts, tools, items that support the children's interests. See Appendix 24 of the Operator's Manual - Materials and Equipment for School-Age Children for more information.			
32(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall provide indoor play area materials and equipment that are (d) clean and in good repair.	32(1)(d)	Jan 10, 2022	
Comments: Pool table in poor repair. To be repaired or removed. White cube shelving dusty.			
39(2) A licensed facility shall have a separate locked storage space that is inaccessible to the children for each of the following: (a) toxic products, chemical products and cleaning supplies;	39(2)(a)	Jan 10, 2022	
Comments: Glass cleaner under sink in small bathroom. Lysol cleaner, toilet bowl cleaner, and air freshener spray in unlocked cupboard in kitchen. Toxic products must be locked by either a csa approved lock or by lock and key.

Recommendation to add mats at entrance to eliminate tracking of dirt and snow into the play area.
