Comments: Deficiency is now compliant							
Observed toxic products in all classrooms and in the bathroom that were put up out of the children's reach but were not locked. Toxic products that were observed not being locked were Windex, disinfectant wipes, disinfectant spray, Lysol toilet bowl cleaner. Administrator was able to lock all toxic products at time of inspection.							
General Comments							
Preschool children were gone on a walk when I arrived for today's renewal inspection. The infant and two-year- old educator informed me that they were outside earlier in the morning.							
Parents provide the children's snacks and meals. Educators have a microwave in each classroom to warm up the children's food if need be. While the children were waiting for their food to be ready, the two-year-old educators were heard singing a Santa song to the tune of "BINGO".							

All educators were observed being attentive to the children during time of inspection, they were also quick to act and comfort children when needed. They were also observed ensuring they got down to the children's level when speaking with them. Observed all educators playing with the children either at tables or on the floor at different time throughout today's inspection.

Observed positive child guidance practices such as offering choices, assisting children in decision-making and using gentle reminders when needed.

General Comments

Please ensure that toxic products are always locked. The only product you can keep out but still needs to be kept out of the children's reach is diluted spray bottles (bleach or quat) that are used for cleaning tabletops, change tables, and toys.

A reminder that it is the operator's responsibility to ensure that all stationary play structures are surrounded by the appropriate depth of protective surfacing as outlined in the structures manufacturer's manual or as per section 9.3.2 of the Operator's Manual. The material used for protective surfacing should be turned over (raked) weekly to ensure proper depths are maintained.

Several child files had pictures of their Medicare card, please ensure that the Medicare number is written on the Child Profile for inspection purposes.
