Comments: When the inspector verified the ratio, it was compliant. However, one educator initially reported having 17 children, while the inspector counted 18. It is essential that educators always know the exact number of children in their care. The educator recounted and adjusted his number accordingly. Deficiency is now compliant			
22(5) Immediately on demand by an inspector, the operator or administrator of a licensed facility shall produce a record or document required by the inspector under subsection (4).	22(5)	Jul 31, 2025	Jul 31, 2025

24(1) For the purposes of subsection 20(1) of the Act, the following records and documents shall be maintained on the premises of a licensed facility: (f) daily attendance records of the children on forms provided by the Minister.	24(1)(f)	Jul 31, 2025	Jul 31, 2025
Comments: The inspector observed that the daily attendance sheet was not completed accurately. One child, who was away on an outing, was marked as present. Additionally, two children who were on site were not signed in. Attendance records must be completed each time a child arrives and leaves, accurate and reflect all children present at any given time. The educator corrected the attendance sheet accordingly. Deficiency is now compliant.			
31(3) An operator shall maintain the outdoor play area of a licensed facility to ensure the safety of the children.	31(3)	Aug 01, 2025	
Comments: The inspector observed, in the outdoor play area, the presence of stagnant water in tires. Stagnant water in an outdoor play area can pose several health and safety risks for children. To ensure a safe and hazard-free environment, the inspector recommends implementing a routine cleanup of the outdoor play area before each use.			
33(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall provide outdoor play area materials and equipment that are varied and in sufficient quantity for the number and ages of the children receiving services at the licensed facility.	33(1)	Aug 15, 2025

Comments: The inspector observed that the outdoor play area contained only 8 Tonka trucks, 2 of which were broken, along with some tires used for play. Additional toys must be provided to ensure there is a sufficient quantity and variety of play materials available for all children attending the facility.			
40(1) An operator of a licensed facility shall ensure that personal belongings of a child receiving services at the licensed facility that are brought to the licensed facility, including combs, brushes, toothbrushes, towels, washcloths, bedding, pacifiers and soothers, are (a) labelled with the name of the child.	40(1)(a)	Aug 08, 2025	Jul 31, 2025
Comments: The inspector observed several water bottles without the children's names on them. The educator was informed, and the bottles were labeled before the inspector left the premises. Deficiency is now compliant			
48(2) An operator of a licensed facility may supply food to a child receiving services at the licensed facility that a parent or guardian of the child brings from the child's home if the food is labelled with the child's name and refrigerated, as required.	48(2)	Aug 08, 2025	Jul 31, 2025
Comments: The inspector observed several lunch boxes without the children's names on them. The educator was informed, and the lunch boxes were labeled before the inspector left the premises. Deficiency is now compliant			

General Comments
<p>The inspector is on site to conduct the renewal inspection.</p> <p>At the time of the inspection, the inspector did not have access to the filing cabinet (when needed), where staff records, and child records were stored. As per section 22(5) of the ECS Act, immediately on demand by an inspector, the operator or the administrator of a licensed facility shall produce a record or a document required by the inspector under subsection (4). The inspector asked the educator for access to the filing cabinet, but the educator was unaware of the key's location. The educator contacted the administrator, who provided the information approximately 30 minutes later, allowing the inspector to access the staff and children's records. The operator must ensure that a key is accessible to staff to prevent delays in the future and that all staff be informed of its location to ensure consistent access to files. The deficiency is now compliant.</p> <p>A discussion was held with the administrator regarding the procedure for handling prescribed medication. The administrator informed the inspector that a child had recently been prescribed medication requiring refrigeration, but there was no secure, locked storage on site for the refrigerator. The administrator stated that she plans to provide a lockable container, such as a lunch box with a key, to store medication in the refrigerator.</p> <p>During the inspection of the outdoor play area, the inspector observed an employee from a neighboring business smoking near the play area of the childcare facility. The administrator informed the inspector that a previous conversation had already taken place with the manager of the business regarding this issue. The inspector advised that a follow-up conversation should be held with the business owner to reinforce that smoking must occur off the premises.</p> <p>During the inspection, both indoor and outdoor play activities were observed, as well as the lunch period. The inspector also observed a science activity being conducted with the children, along with a craft station featuring yarn-based materials.</p>
