General Comments

The Quality Assurance Monitor is on site to conduct a monitoring inspection.

During the visit, the following items were verified:

- Required postings were displayed in a visible and prominent location within the facility.
- Child records included all required information.
- Signed consents were present in each child's file.
- Incident records were available.
- Daily activity records were documented.
- Indoor play areas were observed.
- Indoor play materials and equipment were reviewed.

While on site, the Quality Assurance Monitor observed children arriving from school, engaging in outdoor play, and participating in indoor activities.

A discussion took place between the Quality Assurance Monitor and the administrator regarding an observation made during the visit. The Quality Assurance Monitor noted that when the first group of children arrived with their educator, the Quality Assurance Monitor inquired about the number of children present. The educator took attendance and reported that 10 children were present. The Quality Assurance Monitor conducted a head count and identified 11 children.

The educator then began completing the attendance record sheet. The Quality Assurance Monitor observed that children were dispersed throughout various areas of the facility, making it difficult for the educator to verify attendance accurately.

The Quality Assurance Monitor recommended that both the educator and the administrator ensure that all children are gathered together upon arrival from school so that attendance can be taken efficiently and accurately, ensuring all children are accounted for.
