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General Comments

Licensing Staff arrived at the facility to conduct the annual Renewal Inspection. Upon arrival, children were still arriving for morning drop-off. Families were greeted by staff, and attendance records were updated accordingly.

The indoor environment was welcoming, bright, and well organized. The majority of the children were gathered in the room near the kitchen making slime. A smaller group of children were observed playing with slime and accessories, including rolling pins, cookie cutters, and utensils, in a Tuff Tray.

Educators were observed communicating with the children before setting a visual timer for morning snack. The children worked together to put away the play materials before gathering near the play couch. The group sang a good morning song before reading Kindergarten Here I Come. Some children had difficulty remaining engaged and seated throughout the story. As a reminder, please adjust group or "together time" to meet the needs and attention spans of the children. Proper handwashing was observed before the children ate their morning snack.

The transition to outdoor play was smooth, and a head count was conducted as the children exited the facility. The outdoor play area offered a variety of play materials, all of which were observed to be in good condition. Throughout the morning, the children participated in a variety of activities, including playing soccer, creating colorful water using chalk and markers, bathing babies in the water table, and engaging in active games.

After spending the morning outdoors, the group transitioned back inside to prepare for lunch. Children whose clothing became wet during water play changed before washing their hands and joining their peers for lunch. Typically, only one child naps; however, cots and extra blankets were available should other children feel tired and require rest.

Staff and child profiles were reviewed and contained all required documents. Learning stories, pictures of children engaged in play, and a large display featuring family pictures, pictures of pets, and the children's favorite hobbies were also observed. Fire drills are being conducted and recorded monthly.

A conversation took place on site regarding pre-planning and the importance of following the children's interests when planning experiences. Licensing Staff will continue to support the facility in this area.
