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General Comments
Licensing Staff arrived at the facility to conduct the Renewal Inspection. Upon arrival, the children in the two-year-old classroom were transitioning to the upper outdoor play area, while the three- and four-year-old group was engaged in play in the lower fenced in playground. The classrooms were bright, organized, and welcoming. A variety of age-appropriate materials were available and easily accessible to the children, including books, trucks, puzzles, dress-up costumes, markers, crayons, paper, and paint. Materials were observed to be in good condition. Webbing, learning stories, process art, and photographs of the children were displayed throughout the classrooms and hallways. In the upper outdoor playground, the children were observed dancing to music, coloring, and discussing their shadows. First aid kits and attendance records were brought outside with each group. In the lower playground, children were engaged in a variety of activities, including playing jumbo Tetris, making bracelets, and participating in imaginative play in the wooden playhouse. A broken Tuff Tray on the upper playground and a broken plastic shelf were observed and discussed with staff during the inspection. Both items were removed from the play areas. Ensure that any broken or damaged materials are removed from the environment immediately. Verbal reminders were provided as the groups prepared to transition indoors for lunch. Proper diaper-changing procedures and handwashing were observed prior to mealtime. While the infants and two-year-old children were napping, the three- and four-year-old group was observed engaging in a variety of activities. Children played with Play-Doh and accessories in a large Tuff Tray, made binoculars, participated in dress-up play, and took turns pushing one another in the swing chair. Afternoon snack and outdoor play were observed in all classrooms. Later in the afternoon, two Educators greeted the school-age children at the bus stop. Children were signed in upon arrival, and sunscreen was applied. Some children chose to have afternoon snack while others

participated in crafts, collected bugs, or played basketball.

Positive child guidance was observed throughout the Renewal Inspection. Educators were patient, kind, and engaged with the children. Staff and child profiles were reviewed on site and were found to contain all required documentation.

Licensing Staff recommends renewal.
