## **General Comments**

Pennfield Daycare Inc.

A Monitoring Inspection occurred on June 12, 2024.

Children were observed during outdoor and indoor free play, transitioning to lunch and nap time. Proper handwashing was observed during the transition to inside, with steps or platforms provided to allow children to reach regular-sized toilets or sinks.

Educators stated that the children are presently very interested in gardening in the greenhouse, painting with loose parts, and exploring sensory bins. Educators were observed using positive language and giving gentle reminders. Opportunities are open for individual and group experiences. Various forms of literacy are present in the indoor environment.

Parents of children present at the center are granted entry at any time. Outdoor play occurs for at least one hour in each four-hour block of time when the majority of children receiving services are in attendance, weather permitting. The daily routine is posted in each room. Books have been selected that reflect the children's interests. Well-defined learning and play areas were observed, and several pieces of the children's artwork were displayed throughout the facility. A sensory area is available with sufficient quantities of sand and water, along with accessories that are provided and rotated regularly. Toxic products such as chemical products and cleaners are locked and inaccessible to the children. Drinking water is provided throughout the day. The infant outdoor play area is separate and/or used at different times than other children. Outdoor stationary equipment is surrounded by protective surfacing of appropriate depth.
