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General Comments A renewal inspection occurred today. The daycare demonstrated a strong commitment to creating engaging and developmentally appropriate learning environments. In the infant room, learning stories were posted for each child, highlighting their individual interests and progress. The children participated in a creative activity where they painted using their feet, encouraging sensory exploration and motor development. Parent involvement was evident through a recent visit from a cement truck, which provided a unique real-world learning experience. On a previous monitoring visit, another parent brought in a fire truck and ambulance, further supporting community engagement and safety awareness. In the twos room, the learning environment featured a "Lobster Wall" that displayed family photos of lobster fishermen along with fun facts about lobsters, specifically the American lobster. This activity allowed children to explore marine life concepts and connect learning to their families and local culture. The threes room showcased an art area titled "Meet the Artists," representing each child's creative work. Sensory bins with string weaving were available, promoting fine motor skills and problem-solving. Each learning space reflected current interests and ongoing projects tailored to the children's developmental needs. The fours room included learning stories such as "Fun Making Pumpkins," "Fishing for Sharks," and "Science Experiments," which demonstrated curiosity and engagement in STEM concepts. These activities supported both creative expression and scientific thinking. Outdoors, the environment was well-equipped with a variety of materials, including trucks, shovels, climbing structures, diggers, and ride-on cars, encouraging gross motor development and imaginative play. Children hand washing was observed during the renewal. Fire drills were completed, and staff and children's files were reviewed and complete. Educators were observed actively engaging with children throughout the visit, ensuring meaningful interactions and consistent supervision. They participated in play, facilitated learning experiences, and encouraged exploration across all environments.
