General Comments

A balance of indoor and outdoor play occurred during the morning. Infants enjoyed a walk while preschool children played in the outdoor play environment. Inside, transition to bathroom routine observed to run smoothly with educators engaging children in singing songs while they were waiting.

Portfolios of children's learning have been started. Portfolios highlight children's learning, strengths and ongoing growth and development over time. Pages 6 and 7 of the Collaborative Assessment Tool discusses ways to value and make children's learning visible. This resource can support you in types of documentation you can include in the children's portfolios.

Ensure toys that are on the outside of the fence in the outdoor play area are collected. How do you support children to value the materials provided to them in the outdoor play area so that they are not being discarded over the fence?
