General Comments

Renewal Inspection:

The children were observed playing with playdough, counting, singing, dancing, coloring, and doing yoga. The educators were observed having positive interactions, engaging in play, and having meaningful conversations with the children. Transitions in all rooms ran smoothly. All classrooms were observed going outside. The classroom environments were calm, and all the classrooms had a wide range of open-ended materials that were open and ready for all the children to explore throughout the day. The Administrator was on the floor the entire day supporting the staff and children.

Documentation and pictures of the children reflected the children's on-going learning interests. Educators displayed the children's learning in each classroom environment. Each learning story highlights the children's play experience and reflects the New Brunswick Curriculum Framework.

The outside environments had a variety of materials for the kids to play with, such as balls, sand, and sand toys, mud kitchens, and utensils, reading nook with books, hammocks, giant size connect four, and art materials.

Hand washing, diaper changing, and naptime routines were observed.

The following records were reviewed: Incident reports, fire drills, daily attendance sheets, infant toddler daily sheets, exclusion and return after exclusion forms, administration of medication, and staff professional learning hours.

A review of all staff and child files were completed.

The Inspector discussed updating the parent handbook with the administrator to better align with positive child guidance.
